





Location Services - confirm which apps have access to your location






System Services > click "Details" > Significant Locations > Turn OFF and clear history







System Services > click "Details" > Mac Analytics > Turn OFF






Back out to main Privacy & Security page >confirm choices for the following apps:



*(if there is any app with access to any of these four features that shouldn't, **turn it OFF**)






Full Disk Access > confirm nothing has full disk access (Exception may be company-managed services)








Apple Analytics Turn ALL OFF






Back out to Apple ID settings

Confirm devices listed associated with your iCloud account. If there are any old or unknown devices, select them and click "Remove from Account"






Cloud Private Relay > **Turn ON**



Advanced Data Protection > **Turn ON** – this will require all associated devices to be updated, and for you to select a recovery contact. Once the contact has accepted through the text message, you will repeat these steps to turn on Advanced Data Protection
